 - We do an FSL insert and we sell ads to chapters, the form for this is on the website. We will send out an email but please check into this so you have ample time to prepare for this.
 - Second Exploratory Committee meeting tomorrow at 8:30
 - We will be determining the recommendation tomorrow, it will be presented next week. If the recommendation is to open, we will have a two week period for it to sit before we vote (at the May 1st meeting).
 - Associate Chapter Recognition meeting tomorrow at 6:15
 - For Sigma Alpha Epsilon Pi, a jewish sorority that wants to become an associate chapter. The recommendation will be decided tomorrow. They will be visiting on the 24th of April.
 - Fall Tailgates: There is a policy underway to allow for tailgating at houses off campus. It would still allow for on campus tailgating, it would require BYOB tailgates to have security and enhances safety along with fraternities with facilities to have alcohol in their facilities for tailgates only. The policy will be presented on the 17th of April. This will

not impact PHA's events, but it does impact the women of our community. It must pass all councils for it to pass, hence why we will be voting.

- Alpha Sigma Kappa: What would it look like without this policy?
 - Lindsay: BYOB tailgates could occur anywhere, there are a few student tailgating areas on campus. Chances are they would occur in non-fraternity houses off campus. This policy requires security and that alcohol can be in the facilities 5 hours prior and must be gone 30 minutes before the game.
 - IFC is discussing helping support security costs and reserving private security companies. They would not hire these companies through FSL or CSU.
- Amanda: Would security be required if it is a BYOB tailgate on campus?
 - Lindsay: No, there will be 90 law enforcement officers on campus already.
