### **Unfinished Business**

#### Philanthropy Policy Proposal:

- How are they going to combat allowing smaller organizations time to adequately plan with the four week deadline?
  - Two weeks is the minimum for getting any event approved on the calendar, four weeks is important because it allows groups time to plan and make changes to work with events planned by other organizations.
- Who determines if additional event requests are approved? And to make sure they are fair?
  - It will be mostly first come first serve, if you are having more than one it would be given to a chapter who hasn't yet done their signature. The only thing that is limited is the signature event.
- Lindsay: The VPs/Directors of Community Service and or Philanthropy will be working with the OFSL to make these decisions.
- There can be various types of philanthropies on one day, but the limit is on the amount of the same type of philanthropy per day.
- Will there be a certain amount of time that a chapter will know if there event is approved or denied?
  - Chris has typically completed these within 48 hours.

#### Extension Discussion:

- We were worried that some organizations is not meeting the mean chapter size, how would a new chapter impact this?
  - We discussed this in depth, we have discovered in the past that when there are more options, more PNMs stay within the process. Most PNMs leave because

they did not get asked back to their preferred chapter, by adding another option it draws more PNMs and provides more of a “home”.

- With the addition of a group in 2014, it did not impact the amount of groups that reached quota.
- We talked about in the committee that many girls are concerned about the quality of sisterhood, especially as sisterhood grows.
  - Panhellenic talks about this a lot but there are programs and materials that we can provide to help with this issue, it is definitely something we can provide for you in the future. Anything over 150 is a “Mega Chapter” and many of our chapters are at this size.

#### Risk Management Discussion:

- Amanda Burke: Our house mom’s largest concern was the availability of private security to protect our facility.
  - Tyler: Over the summer we are looking into renting a security service for the fraternities and creating a list of available security companies. I could send out a list now once passed.
  - Allyson: We already know the football schedule so you can reserve them very far in advance!
- Where is the “Great Green” or is there a map to show student tailgating? Which organizations would this impact?
  - We believe it is online. It is just west of the LSC, this is a programming area that will have things other than student tailgating. As of right now, the only student only “tailgating” is the TILT parking lot. Alpha Gamma Rho, Kappa Sigma, Pi Kappa Phi, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Phi Kappa Tau would be able to have tailgates, all other fraternity facilities are dry.
    - Amanda: I will get a copy of the map to send to you.
- What about chapters that don’t have a facility?
  - They would still have to follow this policy except for the security. If they violate the policy regardless of a facility presence or not they will go through the JJB process.
- What if this doesn’t work out?
  - We have an ongoing workgroup, if this doesn’t work we will do what we can to change the policy to reflect the needs of our community as they change. **Anyone is welcome to join the work group over the summer or during the year, if they want to become involved email Tyler Piersch.**
- Is the stadium dry?
  - The stadium is wet, the Great Green and TILT lots will also be wet but regulated similarly to Hughes with wristbands and ID checks.
- Delta Delta Delta, We discussed this as a chapter and also brought up the incident that occurred in 2006 that raised concerns.
  - In 2006, there was not as much regulation, and lack of a strong policy. We hope that this can increase safety opposed to unregulated activities in off-campus housing that is not held accountable by a policy. It is up to your chapter how they choose to vote, but our community is fundamentally different than it was in 2006.

I don't think the work group would have come to this decision lightly. I believe [Lindsay] that this is the best way to maintain the safety of our members. This does not mean that there will be alcohol in facilities at any other time, which is also different from 2006 when alcohol was allowed in all parts of a facility.

- Allyson Berry: It is important to vote in a way that reflects your chapter membership but also keep in mind what tailgating could look like without this policy.
- Lindsay: There will be approximately 45 spaces via a lottery with groups getting probably a space for one game with grills allowed, and 20 tented spaces (no grills allowed) on the Great Green.
- What does tailgating at other universities look like?
  - Noah Mills, IFC President: There was a lot more student availability for tailgating on other campuses. We came to the conclusion, that without student places it will occur off campus (probably random houses) by offering facilities with security will create a space for Fraternity and Sorority members to maintain the same experience that Hughes offers. This will also increase safety and accountability. We still don't understand what game day will look like, by creating this policy we are being proactive opposed to seeing game day and then creating a policy.

### **New Business**

Associate Chapter Presentation, Sigma Alpha Epsilon Pi

- How large is your chapter?
  - Currently 23 with 13 founding mothers, we hope to have approximately 50 members.
- What does your chartering process look like?
  - We have to join as an associate chapter first, then we hope to charter in the Fall, with a ceremony and awards. Our nationals is heavily involved with that process. We can then wear letters and things like that!
- Associate Chapter Presentation Recommendation: Unanimously in favor of having SAEPi joining PHA.
